August Topic: Giving Our All

Romans 12 is one of my favorite chapters in the Bible. It speaks about our response to the great gift of salvation and how we are to live our lives in the joy of our salvation. Trailman, in Christ we have been given everything we need, so we are free to give everything we have. But what does that really mean? And, what does that look like in our everyday lives? So today commit to being a Romans 12 Trailman, reflecting the transformation of new life that you have been given in Christ and fueled by the Holy Spirit to reflect Christ and share His love with others. Surrender yourself to the Lord's will and be transformed to live for Him.
